List any academic honors, scholarships, community service, volunteer work, or awards received since entering high school. Identify your area of interest and how you feel you can contribute to the Surveying and Mapping and or Geospatial profession. Outline your knowledge of legal and technical aspects of your field of study and your desire to advance in a profession. Include any applicable job experience, involvement with civic and professional associations, and your plans after graduation.

An oral interview may be required to determine the successful applicant.
